Directions to the Cradle of Aviation Museum:

- From the Southern State Parkway: take the Meadowbrook Parkway north to exit M4, follow signs to Nassau Coliseum (this will put you on Charles Lindbergh Blvd.), stay on Charles Lindbergh Blvd. to the second traffic light and turn right into the parking lot.
- From the Northern State Parkway: take the Meadowbrook Parkway south to exit M4 and initially follow signs to Nassau Coliseum. Within approximately 1/4 mile take the right fork to Charles Lindbergh Blvd., remain on it to the second traffic light and turn right into the parking lot.

The **Tin Alley Grill** is about a mile from the museum. Turn right out of the parking lot onto Charles Lindbergh Blvd., keep right to go onto Quentin Roosevelt Blvd., turn left onto Stewart Ave., and make a U-turn after about 0.4 miles.

CRADLE OF AVIATION MUSEUM

On entering the four story glass atrium, the entrance to the Reckson visitor center, one is immediately confronted by a Grumman F-11 in a shallow dive, its nose pointed at the door. A little higher up, a 1929 Fleet biplane can be seen in a 60-degree bank and elsewhere a "pilot" appears to be maneuvering his Paramotor, the only flying machine currently in production on Long Island. These and half a dozen other suspended exhibits prepare the visitor for a unique historical tour. For over a century, from the first flights by frail biplanes on the Hempstead Plains, to man's walking on the Moon, Long Island has been on the leading edge of America's aviation and space adventure. Long Islanders have helped transform aviation from a spectator sport to a major means of commercial transportation. In addition, a large portion of America's aerial arsenal in time of war was produced at facilities here on the Island. The many historic flights that transpired here, and the many aviation companies that developed here, helped make aviation the integral part of our world that it is today. The museum provides a record of all these achievements, its exhibits ranging from the earliest kites to space exploration vehicles.




